

#### CYCLE RIDE WITH COMBINED WINE TASTING **SWANSON TO KUMEU**



A cycle ride with a difference. Meet at 10am and park at the Metro carpark on Swanson Road. The Metro carpark is free and is located behind the Challenge Petrol Station, just before the Swanson Railway Station. From here we will cycle along Swanson Road on the footpath, turn into Waitakere Road which is a quiet rural road cycling through Taupaki then onto the Kumeu main road roundabout. From here we will cycle on the footpath to our 1st wine tasting at Soljuns, then our 2nd wine tasting at Kumeu Winery Estate. We can have lunch after at the Bakehouse Cafe in Kumeu or bring your own lunch and have it in the Taupaki Domain

Further Info: The cycle ride is approx 14kms one way. Waitakere Rd is mainly flat with only 2 moderate hills each way. Although there are no cycle lanes, if we cycle in a single file with hi-vis jackets we should be safe. Lunch stop at Soljans is not recommended as it is up market and you need to book in advance. For those who do not have a bike and want to join us for wine tasting, you are welcome. Please note the wineries charge for wine tasting - 6 different varieties
