

ONETANGI TO MAN O'WAR BAY WALK, WAIHEKE ISLAND

Sunday 15th November 2015

Walk is 16kms and will take about 5 hours. Starts at 8.30am at Charley Farley's Cafe, The Strand, Onetangi, Walk is graded as medium so need a good level of fitness. Walking on mostly metal road with a bit of track and some long steady hills. A nice little climb takes us to through the Onetangi Forest and Bird Reserve to Pohutakawa Lookout and from there enjoy

BIKING WITH THE BIRDS

Saturday 21st November 2015

Ambury Park Farm Coastal Track. The distance from the Kiwi Esplanade carpark return is approx 22kms and will take approx 2 to 3 hours. The ride will not be suitable for road bikes, but okay for hybrid and mountain bikes. There are two biking options for the day, a longer A ride, and a shorter B ride. 'A' riders meet at 8.15am for 8.30am start at end of Hugo Johnson Drive. Bike 5kms along cycleway past Waikaraka Park, across the old Mangere Bridge to meet up with 'B' riders in the Kiwi Esplanade Carpark.

A cycle ride with a difference. Meet at 10am and park at the Metro carpark on Swanson Road.
