SOUTH KAIPARA WALK AT MATAIA FARM

Sunday 29th January at 10am

Meet at Mataia homestead, 2791 Kaipara Coast Highway, Glorit.

The Mataia 1 day walk is a 12km circular walk passing over rolling farmland alongside salt-marsh wetlands through beautiful coastal forest and native bush with stunning views across the Kaipara Harbour. This newly opened walk is on a private farm and a conservation project and will take about 5 hours return.

Directions: Take the Northwestern motorway to Helensville. Mataia farm is located 17 km past Kaukapakapa. The mailbox number is 2791 Kaipara Coast Highway. Look out for a white double story old villa with a m shaped red roof. Park inside on the property.

For those wanting to car pool, please inform Mike so we can arrange a central pickup. Those that are driving up, I suggest you leave Auckland 8.30 - 8.45am. The traffic on SH 16 for the Sunday Anniversary weekend should be relatively quiet.

The walk will proceed regardless of the weather. The farm owner will give us a brief health and safety meeting together with directional maps before we start.

WHITE WATER RAFTING

Saturday 11th February 2017 at 10.45am

Vector Wero Whitewater Park, 770 Great South Rd, Wiri

From Auckland city take the Southern Motorway and exit via the Redoubt Road off ramp. Turn right on Redoubt Road. Turn left on Great South Road. The park is 700m to your left. Enter through Gate 3 or 4. From Papakura take Southern Motorway and exit 449A-B for Great South Road. Turn left on Great South Road (signs for Manurewa). The park is 400m to your left. Enter through Gate 3 or 4.



We are doing River Rush which is Grade 3-4. The course is 300m long and has the equivalent of an Olympic swimming pool being pumped down it every 95 seconds, 1-2 m high waves, broken water, stoppers and strong eddies, exposed rocks, and small falls; and have a passage that may be difficult to recognise from the river; and require manoeuvring to negotiate the rapids. Optional 4.5m waterfall at the end.

There is half an hour training then an hour on the water. Seven people plus the guide per raft. Buoyancy aid, safety helmet, paddles and booties are provided. There are showers and changing rooms. Further info: http://wero.org.nz

KAYAKING - RAGLAN

Saturday 25th and Sunday 26th March

Travel down to Raglan Saturday morning. Have lunch, then explore the many and varied shops that Raglan have to offer i.e. galleries, art shops etc. If you don't want to see the shops, there are some walks to do in the Raglan area varying from 3 and a half hours to short walks around the Raglan harbour. We will go out to dinner on Saturday evening. On Sunday morning, we will do a kayak trip for 3 hours from 8am to 11am with Raglan Kayak & Paddleboard. After this – we can either have lunch in Raglan then visit the Bridal Veil Falls before travelling back to Auckland. (A suggestion of mine is after the kayaking we could travel up to Wrights Waterfall Cafe in Patumahoe for lunch and a look around the gardens. (There is a \$10/\$12 charge for the gardens.) This would take about 1 hr 50 mins to get there but is on the way back to Auckland. We can discuss this later. At this stage I have booked two tourist flats at the Raglan Kopua Holiday Park for Saturday night at \$110 a night for up to 2 people. They sleep up to 4 people (1 x dble bed, and a bunk set). There is a kitchen, bathroom with toilet and shower, linen provided.

Other accommodation if required are kitchen cabins (\$85 night) and studio units (\$105 night). Tent sites are available at \$18 a night.
